MMEA - NORTHEASTERN SENIOR DISTRICT CHORUS AUDITIONS

Registration Deadline: Tuesday, October 17

Sign-ups have been underway for the Northeast District Senior High Choral Festival auditions, and at this point, all interested students should have connected with either Ms. Labrie or Mr. Iannuzzi about registering. A successful district audition and participation in the Northeastern District Festival Chorus qualify you to audition for All-State Chorus. Both festivals are terrific experiences: a way for you to connect with other outstanding high school singers, perform great music and learn from guest conductors. The All-State Chorus performs each year at the MMEA (Massachusetts Music Educators Association) Conference at Symphony Hall in Boston. As this choir represents the best of the best high school singers in the state, it is quite an experience!

Senior District auditions are held on Saturday, November 18 at North Andover High School (transportation is provided by LHS). For the audition, you will prepare a choral piece, *I Will Be With You* (Sarah Quartel). There is also a sight singing component to the audition. Sheet music will be provided by Mr. Iannuzzi. At the audition you will sing to pre-recorded MIDI tracks "minus one" (all parts but your own). These mp3 files are available for reference and practice on the Northeastern District site linked below. You will be expected to prepare notes and rhythms for this piece outside of school. We will also rehearse several times after school in preparation for your audition. You are expected to attend some of these run through rehearsals.

ANNOUNCING THE 7TH ANNUAL LHS CHORUS MATTRESS FUNDRAISER

Since 2011 we have run a fall mattress sale fundraiser in the music department with Custom Fundraising Solutions (CFS). This annual fundraiser has been a boon for our department, and many others in our area, allowing us to raise thousands of dollars with minimal effort on the part of our students and faculty.

Over the years, the sales have been enormously successful, and the monies (about \$60K now) have gone to terrific use:

MICCA bus costs

Registration and bus for the WIAF a cappella festival

Registration for Madrigal Singers WGBH "Sing That Thing" television vocal competition

Guest artist travel, lodging and stipends

Purchase of choral performance binders

Printing event posters and programs for international concert tour concerts

Offset choral accompanist stipend

Bus offset and clinician stipend for Chorale Six Flags outing

Refreshments and flower gifts for Senior Gala Recital
Financial aid for domestic and international concert tours
(2012, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019, 2023)

In addition to these items that have direct benefit to our students, we have also sold 50 twin mattress sets which were donated to three Boston area homeless shelters.

We are extremely fortunate in Lexington to have such amazing support for our arts program and curriculum. Many of our yearly needs are met by budget funds. However, fundraising is needed in order to continue to embark on "added value" experiences that provide the kinds of exciting and enriching opportunities our program offers to students. This "one and done" fundraiser is the only time we ask families to participate in such a sale. Students are not asked to sell mattresses, but participating families spend time advertising the sale, trying to find folks who are in need of new mattresses, and encouraging them to check out the no-pressure showroom set up by CFS in the LHS Gym. Besides presenting a low-effort method to earn money for our program, the sale itself is a lot of fun and a nice way for students in the program to bond.
